- ***Monthly Dues*** As of January 1, 2011, monthly union dues are now \$39.50 per month.

Comprehensive Physicals, Laboratory Testing, PSA, Fecal Occult Blood Test, Chest X-Ray, CBC with Differential, EKG with Interpretation, Urinalysis, Vision Testing and a Whisper Hearing Test. Please request the Boilermakers Annual Physical when making an appointment.
- ***Jobsite Injuries*** Local #13 has seen an increase in jobsite injuries and accidents. Please take the time to work safe and don't take any safety issue for granted. Insist on making sure that your work area is safe. Good housekeeping is a good place to start. Also, follow all lock out and tag out procedures and read the work permits each time you enter a vessel or confined space. Take the time to work safely! If you do get hurt it is imperative that you immediately notify the jobsite superintendent and the steward of all injuries no matter how minor the injury. This important step helps protect your ability to a workmen's compensation claim. Please notify the union hall immediately of any unpaid medical bills that you may receive due to a result of a workmen's compensation injury. Do not make any deals with contractors. I would also like for all members to contact me (James W. Banford, Jr.) personally about all injuries, no matter how minor you may think they are. Please work safely!

Rigging Safety Alert High lines are dangerous!! Even to a trained eye high lines can appear to be safe when they are not. Always double check your rigging!

Welding, Cutting and Burning Safety Alert - Breathing welding fumes is hazardous to your health, especially hexavalent chromium (Cr(VI)) compounds which are present in stainless steels. These fumes are potential human carcinogens and exposure to these fumes should be minimized. Be sure to protect your health by properly ventilating your work area and breathing zone. The use of proper respirators will also minimize your risk. Take the time to work safely!

The best way to inform the union hall of your layoff is to call the union hall after 4:30 p.m. and leave a message on the recorder that you were laid off. Leave the date you were laid off and the name of the job you were laid off from.

Please call the drug testing facility before going for your drug test to make sure that the facility is still on the list of M.O.S.T. approved collection sites. Also, all Boilermakers must assume that they will be drug & alcohol tested when signing up on all jobs and they must assume that there will be random drug & alcohol testing as well during such jobs.
